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## **PARKING**

Please can we remind parents /carers that drive to/from school that there is restricted parking in operation outside of school in the morning (8:15am-9:15am) and in the afternoon (3pm-4pm). Please ensure that the ENTIRE yellow 'zig-zag' area is free from parking.






#### PACKED LUNCHES

As a school, we encourage all families to take up the offer of a FREE school dinner but we understand that some children may prefer to bring in a packed lunch. We are noticing an increasing number of packed lunches coming into school that not meet the <u>School Food Standards</u>. We encourage parents to follow the principles of the <u>Eatwell Guide</u> to ensure that their child's lunchbox contains:



- a starchy food, e.g. potatoes, bread, rice, pasta
- plenty of fruit and vegetables, e.g. carrot sticks, an apple, sliced cucumber
- a source of protein, e.g. beans, pulses, egg, fish, meat
- a healthy drink, e.g. water

Food items containing high amounts of fat, salt and sugars must be kept to a minimum e.g. one small packet of crisps. Fizzy drinks/energy drinks are not permitted in school. For Health and Safety reasons, we cannot accept packed lunches that have been warmed at home prior to lunch and then dropped off into the school office.
