## **CHURCH SCHOOL INSPECTION (SIAMS)**

All Church of England dioceses and the Methodist Church use the Church of England Education Office's framework for the Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS). SIAMS inspection focuses on the impact of the Church school's Christian vision on pupils and adults. The inspection framework has recently been changed and is now called an Evaluation Schedule.

The Evaluation Schedule has one inspection question: how effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?

This is explored through seven strands:

- Vision and Leadership
- Wisdom, Knowledge and Skills
- Character Development: Hope, Aspiration and Courageous Advocacy
- Community and Living Well Together
- Dignity and Respect
- The impact of collective worship
- The effectiveness of religious education



As a Church of England School, we are due to have our SIAMS next summer term (2019). In order to help us to prepare for the inspection using the new Evaluation Schedule, we requested a 'mock inspection'. On Thursday, 29th November, we were visited by a SIAMS Inspector, Mr Clapham. Mr Clapham is not only a Church School inspector but is also the Headteacher of an outstanding church school in Dronfield. Mr Clapham spent the morning in school we us, meeting staff, parents and children. He also spent time observing in classrooms and during playtime. Mr Clapham met with governors, members of the senior leadership team and spent a significant amount of time looking through key documentation. The report from the visit was incredibly positive and identified the following strengths:

- The school has a clear and inclusive vision (LOVE) which is clearly understood by the whole school community.
- Parents speak highly of the school as a church school, exemplified through recent questionnaires.
- The school is characterised by care and compassion for children, families and the wider communities.
- Governors and clergy are highly supportive of the school.
- Collective worship is valued as an important part of the school day and is enjoyed by the children.

We are incredibly proud of the report, but as always, we are committed to ensuring that we further improve our provision and practise. We are excited to further develop our school vision, ensuring that it is distinctively Christian and underpinned by clear theology. We would like to further develop the Christian values of our school and build our curriculum intention around our school vision. We would like to involve children more when planning and evaluating ur school improvement and introduce practical ways for evaluating the impact of Collective Worship across the whole school community. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Chair of Governors, Reverend Andy and our Foundation Governor, Michael, for giving up their work commitments to meet with Mr Clapham. As always, we value your feedback and we hope that you will continue to be part of this next chapter on our exciting school improvement journey. Thank you staff, parents, governors and of course our wonderful children!

# ACADEMY UPDATE (DDAT)

As you know, over the past year, we have been in the process of converting to join the Derbyshire Diocesan Academy Trust (DDAT).
