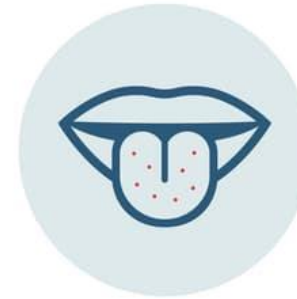

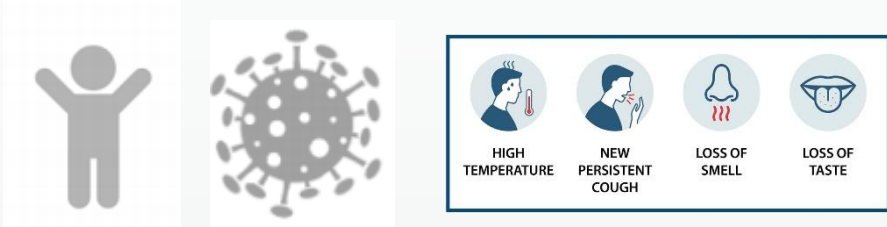

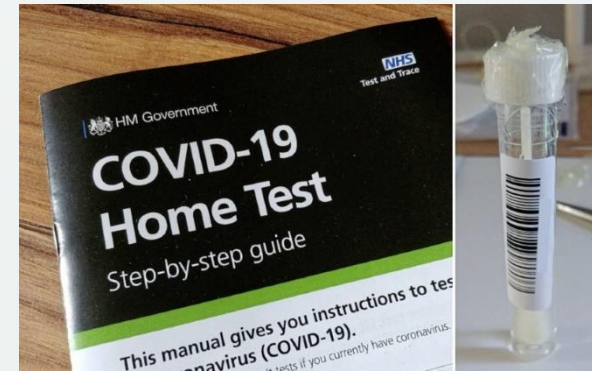
- **Isolate as a family**

My child is showing COVID symptoms....



- **The whole household must isolate while waiting for the test result**
- **Siblings in school must remain at home**



My child is showing COVID symptoms....



- You do not need to call the GP or 111
- Book a test online or call 119

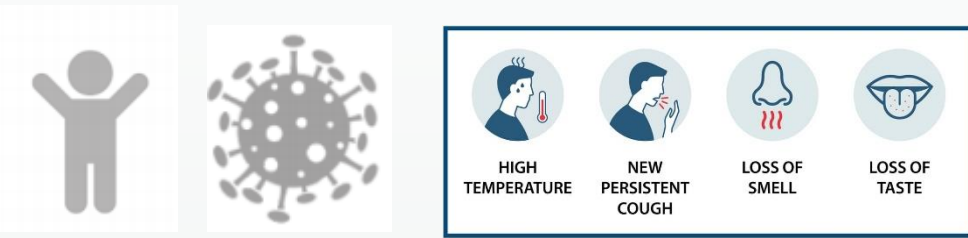

My child has tested negative for COVID....



- **Your child can return - provided they do not have a high temperature and nobody at home is displaying symptoms**

My child has tested positive for COVID....



- Your child must not attend school – contact school
- Your child must isolate for 10 days from first day of symptom(s) or from day of test if no symptoms
- Whole household must isolate for 10 days from first day of symptoms or from day of test if no symptoms
- Your child can return after 10 days of isolation – provided they do not have a temperature and nobody at home is displaying symptoms

Someone in my household is showing symptoms of COVID....



- Your child must not attend school – contact school
- Household member with symptoms must get a test
- Whole household isolates whilst waiting for the test result
- If the test result is negative and nobody else has symptoms, your child can come back to school

Absence due to COVID....



- Regular school attendance is vital. It is so important that children are attending school as much as possible after a very disruptive year.
- If your child is not in school, they are missing valuable learning.
- If your child cannot attend school due to COVID, he/she will be supported with remote learning.



Our priority is to ensure that every child achieves their very best....



- **Having a test is not nice but it is important**
- **After a very disruptive year, our priority is to ensure that our children are now in school as regularly as possible**
- **Please support us by following current government guidance**

Some myth busters....



- **We are not and cannot test children in school – this is for secondary schools only**
- **Only staff are being tested (twice weekly at home)**
- **After 10 days from testing positive for Covid, a cough and loss of taste/smell may continue. Your child can return to school as long as they have been fever-free for 48 hours**
- **If you hear about something and are not sure, talk to us**
- **If you have any worries/fears, talk to us**

Having a COVID Test

If you are feeling poorly, you might need to have a COVID test.

The COVID test is to keep you and everyone safe.

Your mum, dad or an adult from home will help you to have

your test.

You might have your test:

at home or in the car or at a test centre.

When you have your test, an adult will help you to wash

your hands and blow your nose.

First, you will need to open your mouth wide.

Next, an adult will rub your throat with something called

a swab 4 times.

Then, an adult will rub your nostril with the swab for
10
about 10 seconds.

After that, your test is finished.

If you feel worried it is OK. Your mum, dad or an adult from
home will be with you to keep you calm.
