The school has updated its behaviour policy and introduced Class Dojo. Children are better engaged in the new updated systems.  Pupil Premium attendance at breakfast club increased though this now needs to become more consistent and opened up to Reception children (uptake for this group was 0%). Pupil Premium attendance was above non Pupil Premium attendance (95.2% compared to 92.75%). Persistent Absentees was below national for Pupil Premium children (6.8% compared to 8.8%). All children were provided with a school uniform, book bags were in school daily and reading records were completed (supported through whole school reading provision).
