GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE OVER CHRISTMAS

The government is bringing in some new guidelines over the Christmas period which are:

Between 23rd and 27th December 2020:

- You can form an exclusive 'Christmas bubble' composed of people from no more than three households.
- You can only be in one Christmas bubble.
- You cannot change your Christmas bubble.
- You can travel between tiers and UK nations for the purposes of meeting your Christmas bubble.
- You can only meet your Christmas bubble in private homes or in your garden, places of worship, or public outdoor spaces.
- You can continue to meet people who are not in your Christmas bubble outside your home according to <u>the rules in the tier you are meeting in.</u>
- If you form a Christmas bubble, you should not meet socially with friends and family that you do not live with in your home or garden unless they are part of your Christmas bubble.

From 28th December 2020, the Christmas rules will end, and we will return to current restrictions. Further details are available at <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/guidance-for-</u> the-christmas-period

However, the message is simple: COVID-19 has not gone away. The local infection rate has not gone away and it is important that we continue to limit our social contact and take other practical steps (hands—face –space) to protect our loved ones, particularly those who are most vulnerable.

Please continue to look our for COVID-19 symptoms in your children, but also in other family members. If anyone in your household, or Christmas bubble, sjows any of the 3 main COVID symptoms, they and their household should self-isolate immediately and book a COVID test:

*fever *new, continuous cough

*loss of, or change in sense of taste or smell

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR CHILD TASTES POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 OVER THE

HOLIDAY PERIOD

If your child tesst positive to COVID during the holidays, you will still need to inform school. We are still required to inform the Department for Education and there may be further actions for the school depending on the timings of the onset of symptoms.

As our school office will be closed, in the event of your child testing positive during the holidays, you will need to message <u>Ms. Leach via Class Dojo</u>.

In the event that you are not able to access Class Dojo, we have also made our emergency school mobile available:

Miss Gilsenan will be looking after the emergency phone from Saturday, 19th December until Thursday, 24th December between 4pm and 5pm. **Please only use this number to inform us that your child has tested positive.**

Should an individual who has been in school within 48 hours of developing symptoms of COVID-19 receive a positive test result, the school will need to communicate to all close contacts that they must self-isolate for the mandatory 10 days.

If you or your child is identified as a close contact, the school will contact you by text to confirm this and a letter will be sent to confirm what you need to do and any actions you must take via Class Dojo.

Further details have been shared on Class Dojo.

CLASS DOJO All class teachers will be taking a well deserved rest and spending the Christmas period with their own family. Therefore, class teachers will not be responding to messages via

Class Dojo until they are back in school on Monday, 4th January. Ms. Leach and Miss Gilsenan will be checking messages over the holidays in the event of parent/ carer informing school that their child has tested positive for COVID-19. Like teachers, Ms. Leach and Miss Gilsenen will not be responding to any other messages until school resumes again in January. We thank you in advance for your support and cooperation.
