


ATTENDANCE

As we enter the colder season, it is inevitable that the winter germs and bugs will be on the rise again. We are very fortunate to have Mrs Thomas in school who supports with our medical concerns. Regular school attendance is vital: our school target is 96%. It is also essential that children arrive in school on time. Our gates open at 8:45am and our school day begins promptly at 9am. If you arrive after 9am you are late. Please ensure that your child is in school and on ...
