






YEAR 2 CHRISTMAS EXPERIENCE

FIELD DEVELOPMENT

Nurture through Nature

Now that we have finalised our plans, we hope that the next stage of our field development work will commence next term. With the ongoing support of *Down to Earth* and Brendan, we look forward to sectioning off our Forest School area and further enhancing it with the addition of a seated firepit area, a pond and a canopy. You may have already noticed some new structures beginning to take shape using willow, that the children in Bears and Crocodiles have been involved in. We also have some exciting plans in the pipeline to help improve our EYFS playground, which in turn will help to improve our outdoor learning curriculum. We look forward to sharing more details with you as they develop in 2024!

EMOTIONAL LITERACY WORK

Our school improvement work to better support our children's mental health and wellbeing is well underway and you may have heard your child mention some new 'friends' that they have recently made: the *Colour Monsters*. Emotional literacy is the ability to understand, express and cope with emotions. The Colour Monsters are used throughout school to help us to teach, label and understand basic emotions from a young age: *happy, sad, angry, afraid, calm, loved*.













If your child is in Elephants and Flamingos, you may have heard them talk about *Gary the Guard Dog* and *Olive the Owl*. These characters are being used to help teach children about how our brains work and how the brain relates to our emotions. We have started to explore healthy ways

to help us 'regulate' our emotions, for example, deep-breathing, movement and listening to music to restore calm. Our older children have been 'coaching' their brain over the Christmas period, spending time each day to practise positive self-talk. In the New Year, Ms. Leach and Miss Gilsenan will be launching a series of parent workshops on understanding children's behaviour.



Attendance: Every Day Counts

Mrs Morley, Mrs Sohanpal and Mrs Lambert monitor punctuality the same way we monitor attendance.

Please be aware that lateness impacts your child's attendance. As you know our school target is 96%. If your child is late this does make their percentage go down, even if they complete part of the school day. *Punctuality is extremely important.*

The school gate opens at 08:45am.



The school gate stays open until 09:00am.







If your child arrives at school after 09:00am they are recorded as late.

We have to record how many minutes late.

Being late impacts your child's learning. For example, if they are 5 minutes late on 4 occasions they have missed 20 minutes of school. This is equivalent to a phonics lesson. Learning starts in school every day at 09:00am.
