


Dear Parents/Carers,

**RELATIONAL PRACTICE: SHARING OF GOOD PRACTICE** Our relational practice continues to grow from strength to strength and is increasingly being recognised beyond our school. Ms Leach continues to work with other schools across DDAT, and this half term we hosted a visit to share our approach, as well as welcoming colleagues from a Derby City school. We have recently introduced a formal soft start each morning to help children settle and regulate after arrival. During this time, children in Flamingos and Elephants have been taking part in guided meditation sessions, using doodling with music and visual prompts. Reverend Andy joined a session and writes: *"In Tranquill Tuesday we spent quiet time reflecting on how when we feel sad, shedding tears helps us find peace. We listened to calming music as we drew a picture of something that helps us feel peaceful. What a great way to start the day!"*






If you need any support, please speak to your child's class teacher.

**READING BUDDIES** This half term, our Year 2 children have taken on the important role of Reading Buddies. They have been learning how to support younger children with their phonics skills, including how to listen carefully, encourage their buddies, and celebrate their successes. Their first sessions with Reception children from Bears were a huge success, with Year 2s showing patience, care, and kindness, and Reception children confidently sharing their reading and enjoying the experience. This exciting partnership will continue after the half term, helping to develop early reading skills and a love of reading across the school.



**DERBY CITY SMILES: RECEPTION** After the half-term holidays, our Reception children will begin the **Smile 4 Life Programme**, promoting good oral hygiene through daily teeth brushing sessions at school. This programme helps children develop healthy habits and supports their overall dental care. If you would like your child to take part, please ensure you have returned the **permission slip**. We are excited to get started and help our youngest children build healthy routines for life!



## OUR LEARNING: WASTE BUSTERS!

This half term, Bears, Crocodiles, Flamingos and Elephants have started their new theme, **Waste Busters**, where they are exploring how we can look after our world. The children have enjoyed learning all about materials in science, taking part in material hunts around the school and carrying out experiments, including investigating which materials would keep us dry in the rain. They have also been inspired by the artist Henri Matisse, creating their own colourful masterpieces. We will be continuing with this theme next half term and are looking forward to learning more about Wangari Maathai, as well as welcoming visits from Derby City Council to help us learn all about the wonderful world of recycling. Teachers share lots of photographs of the children's learning on Class Dojo, so please check your child's class page regularly to see what they have been up to.



**EYFS COLLECTIVE WORSHIP** Thank you to all parents who attended our EYFS workshop — we hope you found it useful! If you missed it, the presentation is now available on Class Dojo so you can catch up at any time. This half term, our EYFS children have been exploring our core school value of *love*. We began by focusing on how we can love ourselves, helping the children understand the importance of kindness, self-care, and recognising their own strengths. Alongside this, the children have been exploring the Bible story, *The Brave Lady*, which has supported their understanding of love, care, and courage. We will continue exploring The Brave Lady after the half term, using the story to help children think more deeply about how we show love to our friends and family. Please keep an eye out for home learning activities, as the children love sharing their photographs and celebrating their learning at home. Through this work, we continue to embed our school values of love, friendship, compassion, and respect, while supporting children to develop emotional literacy and self-regulation.



## ATTENDANCE

**Reporting Absences:** If your child is unwell, please call the school office on 01332 345997 to let us know. It's really important we know why your child is not in school. If we can't get in touch, we may need to carry out a home visit as part of our safeguarding duties.

**Pharmacy:** For minor illnesses, Pharmacy First is a helpful option. Your local pharmacist can give advice and treatment without needing a hospital visit, while making sure your child gets the support they need.
