





**Leave during term time:** Holidays or other leave in term time **cannot be authorised**. Any unauthorised leave may result in a **Penalty Notice**, which could lead to a fine for each parent, per child. Our aim is to avoid this wherever possible.

We understand that sometimes families need a little extra help to get children to school regularly. We value home-school partnership here at St Chad's. Our first goal is to always work with you to improve your child/ren attendance. We ask that you are open and honest with us about any challenges you may be experiencing so that we can support you or refer on so that you receive the support you need, when you need it.
